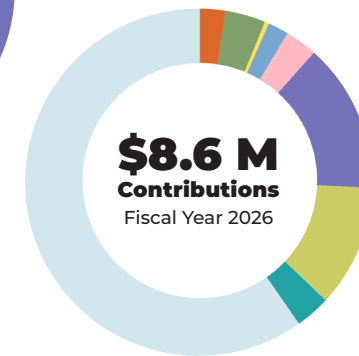
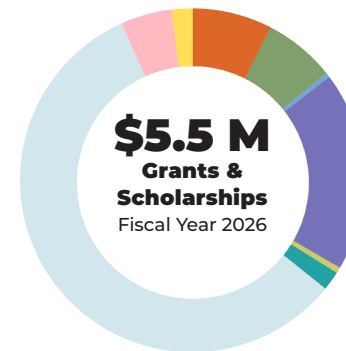

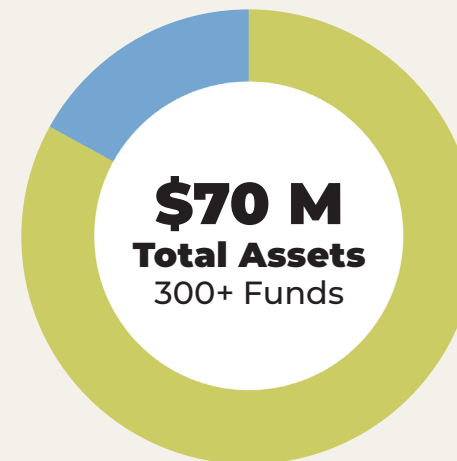


Financial Snapshot

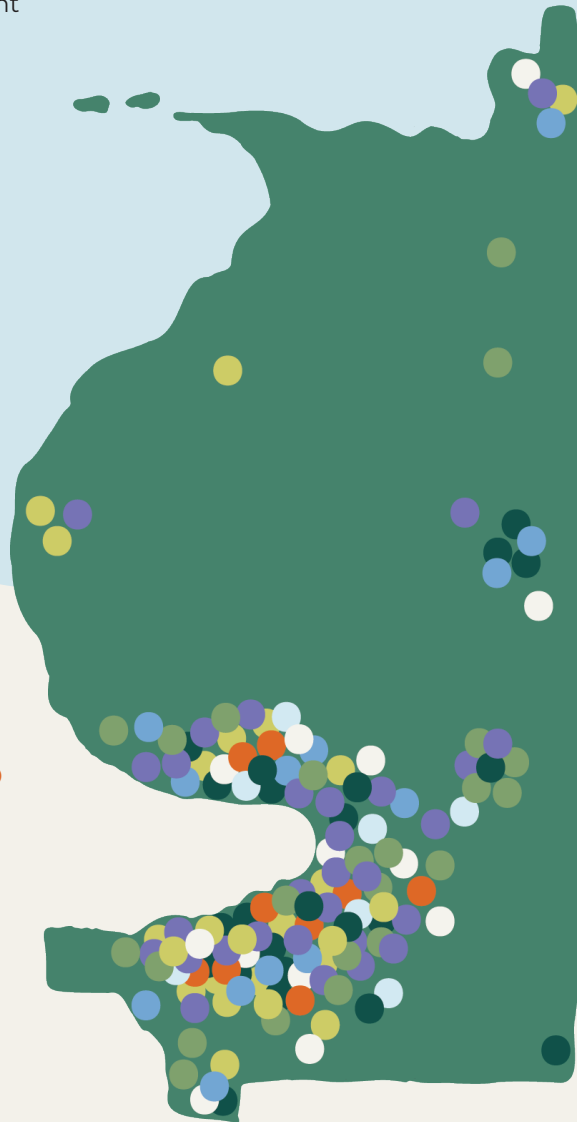

Reaching Across Our Community

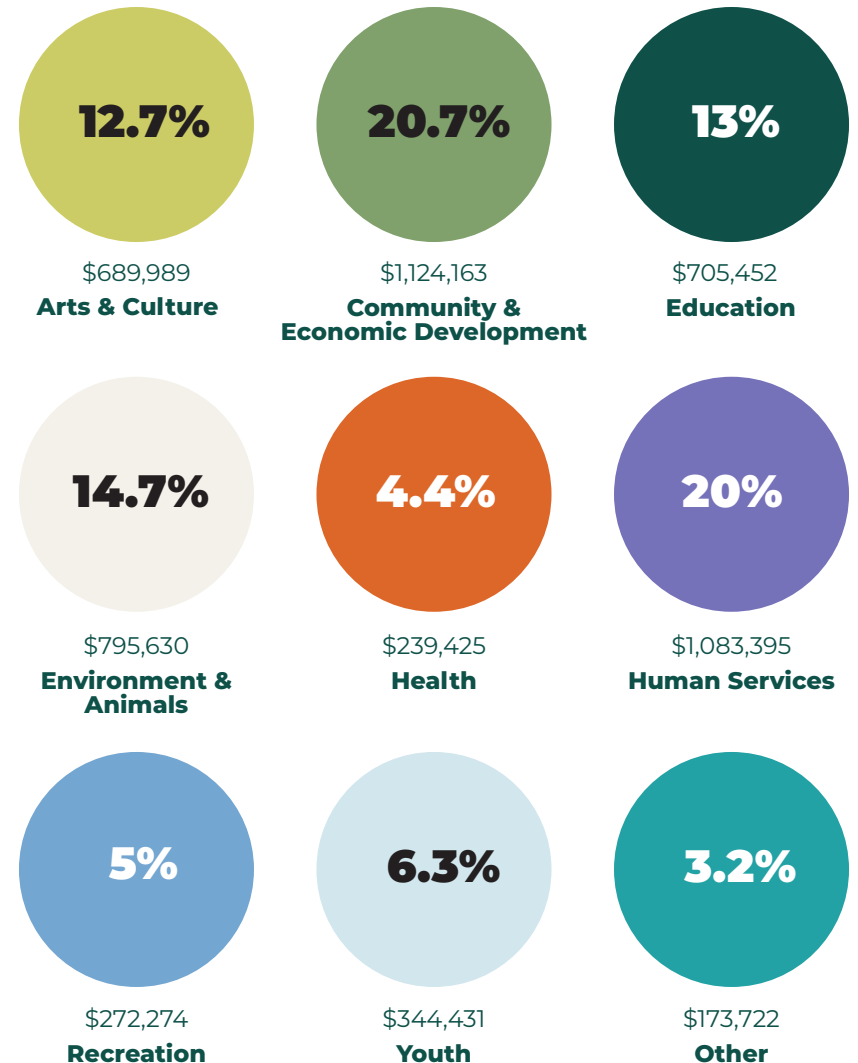

Many Causes, One Mission

Our charitable funds are actively working to make our community a stronger, more vibrant place to live, work, and play. Across Emmet County, the Community Foundation supports kids and seniors, helps neighbors in need, protects natural spaces, strengthens local economic development, invests in health and well-being, and expands opportunities for recreation and the arts.



Making Emmet County Home

After years of collaboration and perseverance, Lofts at Lumber Square is complete, providing 60 new apartments to downtown Petoskey. Those apartments are now fully occupied, and residents are already creating a vibrant community together. Shared meals, game nights, and meaningful connections have become part of life at the Lofts. As one tenant shared, “I love living alone—I just don’t love feeling alone all the time. Problem solved!”

Serving Our Area’s “Missing Middle”

Rents are set to meet our area’s middle-income households (80-120% of area median income).

\$4 Million Raised

Our community came together to raise \$4 million to fill the funding gap and make this project possible.

Lofts at Lumber Square was years in the making, and it would not have been possible without dedication, creativity, and partnership. Like many housing developments across the nation, the Lofts faced a critical challenge: the cost to build exceeded what residents could afford to pay. Without additional support, the project could not move forward. That's where our community stepped in.

Thanks to the generosity of more than 400 individuals, organizations, and businesses, the Community Foundation helped bring the necessary partners together to close the \$4 million funding gap, making the project possible and ensuring rents will remain priced for our area's middle-income households for decades to come.

Making a Difference, Together

Lofts exemplifies the same spirit of generosity that powers the Community Foundation's grantmaking each year. Through our charitable funds, the Community Foundation supports a wide range of projects and organizations that strengthen our region, helping address local needs, create opportunities, and enhance quality of life throughout our community.

The stories that follow highlight just a few examples of that work in action over the past year.

Protecting a Species and Inspiring a Generation of Water Warriors

This year, Pellston science students continued their successful care and release of nmè (lake sturgeon). As part of a larger conservation effort, students across Northern Michigan weigh, measure, and feed the fish in the classroom until the sturgeons' ceremonial release back into the river.

Led by the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians (LTBB), the program's goal is to provide a tangible connection between Emmet County students and lake sturgeon. Since 2019, the Community Foundation has supported this project through grants, and in the Fall 2025 Grant Cycle awarded LTBB funds to expand the program into four more schools.

Lake sturgeon can live for up to 150 years. Before the final release, Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Tribal Elder Fred Harrington shared the cultural history of the sturgeon and told the students, "What do we have to do to make sure this nmè lives to 100? Keep the water clean."

Raising Sails for Local Families

Learning to sail with Little Traverse Sailors (LTS) turned into a summer-long way of life for the Doornbos family. Noah (14) and Jacob (11) both started the community sailing program when they were 8 years old and continue to sail with LTS every summer. Parent and LTS board member Liz Doornbos said her boys developed their sailing skills and built meaningful relationships through the program. “Most importantly, Noah and Jacob have learned to love sailing as a pastime and as a sport. They have developed a deep appreciation for the beautiful place we call home and have gained skills and competence that will carry far into their future lives. As a family, we are so grateful for LTS and all it has brought into our lives!”

LTS provides opportunities for youth to have safe access to the beautiful waters of Northern Michigan, and their goal is for local residents to make up 50% of their student base. Last fall, LTS received a grant to offer a local rate to youth in Emmet County, making the program accessible to more families. As the Doornbos family discovered, sailing on Little Traverse Bay can be a formative experience for kids to build sailing skills, confidence, and connections that last well beyond a single summer.

Moving Across Generations

Through dance, area youth have formed deeper connections to history, creativity, and our community.

During our Fall 2025 Grant Cycle, the Community Foundation supported Crooked Tree Arts Center (CTAC) in celebrating dance legend Martha Graham and the 100th anniversary of her dance company. Martha Graham created a new language of movement that reflected the minimal modernist aesthetic and ideas of the early 1900s, and her techniques continue to have a lasting impact on dance education. Throughout the summer of 2026, CTAC hosted live dance performances by the CTAC School of Ballet, two gallery exhibitions, classes, workshops, and special events celebrating Graham’s revolutionary work.

The project’s connection to Petoskey is tied in part to Peter Sparling, a former principal dancer with the Martha Graham Dance Company, who spent his childhood summers in Bay View. During a visit to CTAC eight years ago, he connected with artistic director Heather Raue. The two began a series of annual collaborations focused on choreography and mentorship for student dancers.

This summer, Raue and Sparling led CTAC dancers in a performance of Graham’s original work, as well as a modern reimagining of her *American Document* for Northern Michigan. Images by visionary dance photographer Barbara Morgan filled the Bonfield Gallery, capturing Graham and her creative contemporaries. By linking past to present and crossing creative disciplines, CTAC is building a more engaged, creative community through the arts.

Their care for the organization and for one another is evident throughout the Pantry, creating a welcoming environment for everyone who walks through the door. The Pantry serves residents of Emmet, Antrim, and Charlevoix counties, and no proof of need is required.

In addition to the warm and welcoming atmosphere, the Pantry's produce display is also impressive. In fact, a summer visitor once saw the fresh vegetables and thought it must be a Farmers Market!

To support the organization's long-term sustainability, the Pantry recently established an endowment fund with the Community Foundation. This permanent source of funding will help sustain the Pantry's work well into the future, providing dependable support as it continues serving neighbors across Northern Michigan.

Leading the Way to New Careers and a Stronger Community

North Central Michigan College saw a community need for flexible pathways into new careers that would help strengthen our local workforce. In late 2021, they began offering Fast Track programs: short-term, non-credit career certifications designed to help students gain in-demand skills and enter the workforce quickly.

Through partnerships with local businesses, North Central bases their offerings on community needs, job availability, and strong career options. Since the program's beginning, it has continued to grow. North Central's Certified Medical Assistant (CMA) program traditionally graduated two to three students each year. After shifting to the Fast Track model, the program graduated more than 100 CMAs in just three years, most of whom are now working in our community.

The Community Foundation provided funding for scholarships to make these career-building opportunities accessible to more local students. This support not only benefits individuals, it strengthens the systems and industries that keep our community strong, healthy, and thriving.

Fast Track programs include phlebotomy, certified medical assistant, nurse aide, dental assisting, and more. These programs help students build stable careers while helping local employers fill critical workforce needs.

Fueling the Future for Young Aviators



Gus Serra's passion for aviation is unmistakable. That enthusiasm, and a belief that more young people should have access to opportunities in the field, led him to establish the High Flight Aviation Fund at the Community Foundation.

After retiring in Harbor Springs, Gus quickly became involved with local aviation efforts through Char-Em ISD, the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA), and Civil Air Patrol (CAP). Today, he is focused on helping young people pursue their own path in aviation.

The High Flight Aviation Fund supports aviation programs that give students access to training and learning opportunities that may otherwise be financially out of reach. It also includes an endowment component that means it can provide long-term support for the organizations and programs supporting aviation students. An advisory committee made up of representatives from Char-Em ISD, EAA, and CAP helps guide funding priorities and grant recommendations, keeping the focus on opportunities for young people interested in aviation.

By establishing the fund through the Community Foundation, Gus created a way for his passion for aviation to continue supporting students and local programs for generations to come.
